



Over the Autumn Term, Year 3 children took part in outdoor learning sessions in our very own Forest School Setting.

We started their sessions off with investigating risks associated with a Forest School setting, and learning ways of reducing the risks so we can still have fun!

The children then explored how our school rules link to the safety and well-being of themselves and others.



Linked to the class topic of fossils, the children worked together to create some amazing fossil-inspired artwork! We used natural materials found around our Forest School site.





The serious business of stick-whittling produced some very important tools for toasting marshmallows in their last session, along with exploring the three elements needed to make a fire and how to be safe around the fire.





Along the way, we also explored how the different weather and changing seasons affected our immediate environment, facts about trees and fungus, ice and snow, and decomposition and decay. We built team-work skills, developed our resilience, and learnt how to make a great mud soup!
